Clay's Corner

"Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, **not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some**, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near." - Hebrews 10:23-25, ESV

In the world of proof texting, this excerpt of scripture, "not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some" is one of the more common to be used to coerce people into believing that if they do not gather at the church building every time the door is open that they will surely burn in the fires of hell. I've heard it all my life and have even used it in the past to shame others into coming to the church building every time the doors are open. And I was wrong to do so. The idea of wanting to meet together as often as possible was not wrong. What was wrong was shaming others into thinking they were sinning when it was convenient for me to meet and not them. Somehow, we've taken an American tradition, made it a scriptural edict and judged those who do not participate. That is wrong.

Taken out of context. I have found over the years that I can use scripture to justify any and every stance I desire to take, concerning any subject I desire to debate. What I have also found over the years is to do so, is tantamount to becoming one of the false teachers which Peter warned about in 2<sup>nd</sup> Peter Chapter 2.

I said all of that to say this, the change we are about to make in our worship schedule is apt to cause some to refer back to this scripture to make their stand. I understand. I really do. It was not an easy decision to make, breaking an American church tradition that has stood the test of time for almost a hundred years out of almost two thousand vears of church history. But the decision to take our second meeting time out of the building and into the homes of those around us was made after much prayer and searching for an alternative means to accomplish the goals of our church; reaching out to the lost among us, strengthening those who are weak and encouraging those who are hurting.

But to take this excerpt of scripture out of the context of which it was written will only create strife and contention and do nothing to fulfill the full commands of this passage; to stir one another up to love and good works, encouraging one another as we hold fast to the confession of our hope. Think about it. Are you an encourager or a discourager? Did you cling to traditions or cling to the hope that is ours in Christ Jesus?

Already I know of one small family group that will be using Sunday evening as a means to rebuild a family's faith through the use of a small group study. Good things are happening! And I am encouraged by what I see and hear from those who are involved in living the life of Christ and sharing His love. If you would like to start a small group in your house, to build your family faith and to reach out to your neighbors come talk to me, I'll help you set it up and even get you started. Let's begin again, a new / old tradition that dates back to the early days of the church when thousands were being added to their numbers daily.


