

"And every day, in the temple and from house to house, they did not cease teaching and preaching that the Christ is Jesus." – Acts 5:42

From its beginning with Peter preaching the first "gospel sermon" in Acts chapter 2, the church was a force, the likes of which the world had never seen. Preaching a message of salvation, of hope and peace, love and goodwill toward all men, the apostles and early Christians marched against the forces of darkness proclaiming the "Good News" of Jesus Christ. And, literally thousands were being added to THE Church daily.

Immediately too from its inception, the Church was met with opposition and persecution. And for the next three hundred years, as the Church began to grow and flourish, there were periods of intense persecution, by both the Jewish leadership and the Roman government. So much so that many at times feared that its existence would be wiped out. But those fears were unfounded. Though death and suffering awaited many a Christian for their faith, the Church spread like wildfire across the continents of the then known world until it threatened to upset the balance of power within the Roman government.

In 313 AD, with the Milan Edict, Constantine finally did what no previous Roman emperor nor Jewish leader had been able to do; Constantine captured the fire that is the Church and put it in a box, simply by giving it legality within the Roman Empire. And while the years subsequent to that event have seen periods of growth, none of those periods comes close to the periods of growth for the Church as in the days when it was "illegal" to profess Jesus as the Christ.

Beginning November 1st, 2015, the Gonzales Church of Christ is going to open the box and release the Church from the chains that have limited its potential in our city and surrounding areas. Beginning November 1st, we are going to break with tradition and begin a new journey as we seek to spread the message of the Savior in our sphere of influence. No longer will our congregation be confined to a "box". The apostle Paul in his letter to the Galatians proclaimed, "You have been freed for freedom!" WE are going to live free. And we are going to spread the Word of Freedom by once more, meeting house to house and breaking the bread of life.

Some might say, "Wait a minute! What's going on here?" I'll tell you. Our Sunday evening format is changing. Instead of meeting a second time in the "box" that many call the "Church", we are going to release the people who are the "Church" to do what they've been called to do; spread the Word. Through small groups, home Bible study, Teen functions, family functions, service projects and any other means that come available, we are going to break the chains and rekindle the fire of Christ in Gonzales, Texas. Space does not allow me to spell out the things we are going to do in the place of a second service on Sunday nights in just one article. So I will, over the course of the next four weeks, spell out in more detail each week, our plans for the future of our congregation. See you Sunday! Bring a Friend! - Clay
