Clay's Corner

As I peruse the writings of others of the faith, particularly within that last 150 years, I notice one thing; though their lines of thought may parallel or even sometime merge, they most often at some point almost always diverge on the different subjects at hand.

Reading the New Testament, with the exception of Revelation, as if it was written in some secret code that only scholars can discern defeats the whole purpose of the Holy Scriptures; Salvation to all who believe in Jesus, confess their sins and enter covenant with Him through baptism.

(I except Revelation because it was written with the symbolism of the Old Testament that only believers, in particular Jewish Christians, would recognize and understand. To a non-believer that book would just look like a bunch of gibberish.)

Now, I said that to say this, when compared with the detailed, step-by-step, multi-layered Jewish law, the laws of Christianity are quite simple. The laws of Judaism were never met to bring life, only guilt because no one seemed able to flawlessly follow them, except the Lord. New Testa-ment Christianity and its "laws" on the other hand are quite simple. And their design is to inspire a relationship with God through obedience, but also through acknowledgement of grace through faith as the saving component of the sacrifice of Christ.

It is quite simple when one simply takes the time to study; Christianity is not about keeping laws or breaking secret codes of conduct. It is, however, all about surrendering one lifestyle and taking on another.

And still I find, even today, there are those (including myself at times) who seem stuck in this idea that we must read between the lines, we must infer this to mean that and we compound and expand something simple into something disgustingly ugly and difficult. What was once a refreshing breath of fresh air for those who had been burdened by the law of sin and death, has once again, in some circles, become just another set of moral codes, the breaking of which leads to disappointment and ultimately death. And there is no room for grace, there is no room for love, there is no room for the cross because it was decided that surely God didn't mean it that way, but this way.

Peter asked this question of the legalists of the day: "Now then, why do you try to test God by putting on the necks of Gentiles a yoke that nei-ther we nor our ancestors have been able to bear?" (Acts 15:10)

I ask you today, why do you make something so refreshingly simple so impossibly hard? We used to sing a song many years ago, oft times as an invitation song after a sermon. The question it asked was this: "Why don't you come in simple trusting faith? Jesus will give you rest." It was the goal of the early Stone/Campbell movement to return to a simple faith, devoid of creeds and pompous ceremonies and just worship God through His Son, Jesus, in simple trusting faith.

If I were the devil, I'd fix that notion right fast. Wouldn't you? I'd make Christianity as complex as I possibly could. I'd make it as tasteless as the leather on the soles of my shoes. And I'd start drawing circles in the sand that included those who thought like me and excluded those who didn't. Then I'd set up a standard of judgement based on the things "inferred" with just enough of the real truth to make the great lie believable. Sounds eerily familiar.

I leave you with the words of the Apostle Paul to the church in Galatia, chapter 5, verse 1: "For freedom Christ has set us free; stand firm therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery.

Christianity is not about keeping a set of rules. It's about living a new life. It's a life free from the consequences of sin because atonement has been made in full on the cross. Remembering that it is not a license to continue to live in sin, but a license to live in the Son.
