

Doing Beautiful Things

At the time of this writing, there are nine more days before I will stand before two young people and a small crowd of closest friends and relatives of the soon-to-be bride and groom, and help these two become one. It is an honor and a privilege that I am the father of the bride and also the minister that will officiate over her wedding ceremony. This is the second time I will have done this. One more and I'll have both given in marriage and officiated the ceremony of the three little girls God blessed Mary and me with. I can't tell you in words what that feels like. It truly is one of those, "You'd have to be there and do it yourself," moments to understand the emotions involved.

As I prepare today for the moments of that day, naturally my thoughts turn to Jesus. And the first thing on His agenda, after spending 40 days of fasting in the desert with the devil attacking him with temptations on all sides, was a wedding in Cana. Of all the places to go, of all the things to be done, a wedding was His first choice. Again, it's one of those things that you'd have to know the circumstances and the customs of the day to realize the significance of what happened and what it meant that day when Jesus accepted an invitation to this wedding.

I can almost hear those first apostle's voices, "Where are we going Lord?" And His answer? "A wedding." I laughed when I wrote that because, if their faces were like the faces of many today, I can see the confusion and the distorted looks of concern smeared across them, coupled with the moment of doubt that surely He must be kidding, "You're the Messiah! You don't have time for that! We've got a nation to rebuild!" And like unto the time just a few days earlier when He first invited Peter, John, Nathaniel, and Phillip, He simply says, "Come see."

As we turn the page of the history of our church and begin to write the next chapter, one of the things you are going to find is that we are going to step out of our self-supporting suppositions of what we think His ministry should consist of and we are going to actually put into effect what His ministry really was; The Great Push to Redeem Mankind back unto its rightful owner. The Creator!

Some will scoff. Some will second guess. Some will say, that's not the way I would do it. And it's not that your thoughts don't matter, they do. But my response to you is the same as His was to them that day, "Come and See!" Jesus went to a party. He started His ministry at a banquet consisting of people who were dancing in joy, celebrating a new beginning, and drinking real wine in good cheer. And it wasn't the first time, nor the last, that He would be found in such circumstances.

I'm not sure where we came up with the idea that Jesus was always prim and proper, He wasn't. And I am not sure where we came up with the idea that in order to worship Him we have to hang pious looks of pain and anguish on our faces as if we were attending a funeral. We aren't. What we are is attending a celebration of life each time we gather to worship. We are attending a feast reserved for all those who would accept the invitation! And we are sending the same invitation He accepted. "Will you come to the Feast?"

And that's what it's all about anyway. Accepting the invitation: "Come and See." Will you?
