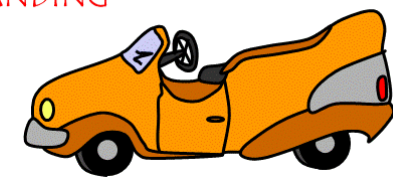

Clay's Corner

I read this morning where one of my favorite personalities, Mike Rowe, shut down someone, named Stan who questioned why Mike wouldn't tell the 10 year-old kid sitting beside him on the plane what was really going on in Orlando; why Mike didn't tell the kid, "they are muslims and terrorists and they are out to kill people like you and me." Mike's response was epic, worthy of mention, and intelligent, "Because he's 10 Stan. And because it's his first plane ride. And because I am not his father."

Just another reason why I really like Mike Rowe.

Then I read a post by Billy Graham's son, asking us to pray for the dead in Orlando including the killer and of course the families as well. And I agree. WE need to pray for all of us. But answer me one question Reverend Graham, "Just exactly what do you want me to pray about for the souls that were lost, killed, dead, and who met their maker and learned of their eternal destination in less time than it takes to blink an eye? I ask you this brother Graham because the same One who will pass judgment on us all did specifically and willfully give us instruction on how we should and should not live out our years on earth. And He did specifically point out in numerous places that there are consequences for living ungodly lifestyles and for accepting Jesus as our Savior and living a lifestyle worthy of His calling? So just exactly what do you want me to say to our Creator Mr. Graham, on behalf of the dead?"

Between the two posts from two different men, I recalled my early life living in fear of the big bad Russian communists. Duck and Cover was the catch phrase of the day. And it is in the "sorta" that left my mind to wonder and create morbid possibilities and fears that any 10 year-old child is capable of conjuring if left to his or her own devices and not told the whole truth.

Which leads to say all of that just to say this:

Mr. Graham, I am praying today. Not for the dead for there is nothing I can say or do or ask that will change the eternal destinies of those already departed. I am praying today for the living. Those who don't know God and live lifestyles that will surely reward them with eternal misery. I am praying for those who profess a belief and never share it. I am praying for those who are hard at work doing their best to make this world a better place to live and sharing both in the material blessings God has given and also the spiritual blessings of the knowledge of Jesus Christ as Lord, King and Savior. And I am praying for the Mike Rowses of the world who are caught in awkward situations and respond to them with a good heart towards those who should never have to experience the ugliness of the adults around them.

And I am praying for myself. That I am a better man today than I was yesterday. That I am a better Christian today than I was yesterday. And that on that day when I meet my eternal destiny, I find my Lord and Savior waiting to welcome me home. And I pray that until that day arrives I do all that I can to ensure that others find the source of eternal life that I now possess. In Jesus Name, Amen.
