

I have a certain way I like to be organized in every aspect of my life. I always knew that it was a different way of being organized, but it works for me and my brain. Often times my organization is backwards from how it would normally be done by maybe most. "You intended to harm me, but God intended it for good to accomplish what is now being done, the saving of many lives." (Gen.50:20 NIV)

We truly need to remember and understand that God has got this. All the good and bad in our lives or the lives of our loved ones, God can and will use it for the good he has planned. That to the best type of good we can get. We must align our lives to His story so we can keep going, forgive, never give up, or back down.
